



### 2008 AIIM Definition:

Enterprise Content Management (ECM) is the strategies, methods and tools used to capture, manage, store, preserve, and deliver content and documents related to organizational processes. ECM tools and strategies allow the management of an organization's unstructured information, wherever that information exists.









# **Key Considerations**

- Has required features
- Infrastructure platform support
- Vendor support (e.g. single vendor)
- Compatibility with existing systems
- Total cost of ownership
- Supported end-user interfaces (e.g. Lotus Quickr Connectors)
- Extensibility (e.g. REST, APIs, etc.)
- Existing technical personnel skills
- Add-on availability (templates, scanning, etc.)
- Available compliance module meets organizational needs






  - Workflow









- Security in the hands of end users


